Most Productive Space



Fitting offices with adequate wayfinding and zoning measures in line with Government guidelines is critical.


By embedding signage within the floor, employees have a clear, constant and visual reminder of how to navigate around the office and distance correctly.



Indoor Air Quality

Tackling Air Quality

The global push for clean air has never been more urgent. Researchers at Harvard University¹ have determined that just a small increase in the long-term exposure to air pollution – particulate matter (PM) or fine dust - significantly heightens the risk of Covid-19 fatalities.

It found that even if people were exposed to only 1 μ g/m3 more fine particulate matter (PM2.5), over time there was an 8% rise in the COVID-19 death rate².

Perhaps surprisingly though, the concentration of pollutants can be two to five times higher indoors than outdoors³. Yet, despite spending 90% of our time indoors⁴, there are no laws to prevent excessive levels of indoor air pollution.

A top concern

Indoor air quality can be affected by factors including thermal comfort, humidity, CO₂ levels, particulate matter, moisture and volatile organic compounds (VOCs).

But it is particulate matter (PM), also known as fine dust, that poses the greatest health risk⁵ as it can penetrate deeply into the lungs⁶ to create or aggravate respiratory or cardiovascular problems and trigger allergic reactions.

Indoor air quality is also among workers' top workplace wellbeing concerns (prioritised by 26% of respondents), according to a survey of 5,500 European office workers commissioned by Tarkett.

As floorcoverings go, DESSO Airmaster has been proven to be eight times more effective at capturing and retaining fine dust than smooth flooring solutions - and four times better than any other carpet⁷.


